Hans Hachmann's hybrid ('Mars' X yakushimanuim 'Koichiro Wada') mid- May bloom, 4'x3'. "From Germany's (and probably the world's) premier hybridizer, a heavy bloomer with reddish pink flowers, shading to white in the throat for a picotee effect." Large tight truss, 18-22 flowers, leaves with slight indumentum, vigorous, healthy, compact plant. Everyone should have this hybrid, a delight.


