Hello fellow members,

As the winter solstice approaches, we can reflect back on a very active and productive season for the Great Lakes Chapter. Two major achievements – assisting financially with the construction of the Rhododendron Discovery Garden at The Holden Arboretum and agreeing to host the 2014 American Rhododendron Society Convention in Concord, Ohio – were initiated during Chas Wagner's tenure as President and have been/will be completed by next spring. These are projects that make our chapter an active player in rhododendron education and outreach at the regional and national levels and are at the core of our group's mission.

The ARS national convention is an opportunity to show people from around the country (and possibly the world) that a broad diversity of rhododendrons and azaleas can be successfully grown in continental climates where few grow naturally. Our chapter has a strong heritage of hybridizers who have created a rich palette of rhododendrons for us to enjoy, and we will be sharing many of these plants (from David Leach, Tony Shammarello, Lanny Pride, Weldon Delp, Robert Blough, Pete Girard, Mark Konrad,* Tom Ring, Joe Gable, and others) with visitors at our convention plant sale. In addition, there will be a full program of day tours to gardens and evening speakers that will highlight our Midwest experience and impress even the most jaded rhododendron connoisseur from the Pacific Northwest. Annette Pizzino has put a great deal of work into the convention agenda that appears in this newsletter and will be appearing in the Winter 2014 issue of the Journal ARS.

Please consider attending the event and getting involved. We seem to be a core group of about 30 members who have been meeting and planning thus far, but the number needed to run the event – bus captains, plant sale workers, registration, auction, hospitality – could be greater. Our March meeting (at The Holden Arboretum on March 15) will be the last opportunity to plan details prior to the Big Show in May. Meanwhile, have a fun and relaxing holiday and a happy New Year.

ARSStore.org - The new ARS Online Store

Every purchase benefits the ARS

At the October 4, 2013, American Rhododendron Society Board of Directors meeting, the Board authorized the creation of an online ARS site that would not be selling items but would link to other providers. The online store was authorized to develop a relationship with Amazon as an affiliate store. The online store was also authorized to use the ARS logo and name to sell "ARS" merchandise. Product providers accessed through the ARS online store at <u>ARSStore.org</u> pay referral fees directly to the ARS on sales made from <u>ARSStore.org</u> referrals. These fees from sales referrals go 100% directly to the ARS. <u>ARSStore.org</u> has no expenses, only earnings.

The store has three divisions:

- ARS Logo Merchandise: featuring knit, woven and denim shirts, caps, visors, and computer briefcases.
- Amazon Merchandise: featuring Rhododendron & Azalea Books, Garden Books, Garden Tools, and any other item sold on Amazon.
- **Participating Merchants**: featuring other merchants who agree to give referral fees to the ARS for each purchase when you mention <u>ARSStore.org</u>.

To access each division, just go to <u>ARSStore.org</u> and from there select what interests you. If you don't see an item, just use the Amazon search feature. Amazon sells just about everything. You get the same low Amazon prices from the ARS store, but by using it the ARS gets a fee for referring you. As long as you go to Amazon from <u>ARSStore.org</u> before making a purchase, the ARS gets a referral fee.

<u>ARSStore.org</u> has the Main Store, a Canadian Store and a European Store. Canadians and Europeans can use the Main Store which uses <u>Amazon.com</u>, but the shipping can be expensive. The Canadian Store uses <u>Amazon.ca</u>, a Canadian affiliate, which carries many of the same things. If <u>Amazon.ca</u> has the item, the shipping within Canada will probably cost less. The European Store uses Amazon stores in the UK, Germany, France, Spain and Italy which can offer lower cost shipping within Europe. <u>Do not</u> go to the other Amazon stores directly from <u>Amazon.com</u>. If you do, your purchase will not qualify for a referral fee. Go to <u>ARSStore.org</u> first and use links from there.

You may wonder if people who are not members of the ARS may use <u>ARSStore.org</u>. Yes, most certainly! The objective of creating the ARSStore website is to raise money for the ARS. The more money we raise, the better it is for the ARS. Invite all of your friends to use it. Invite your favorite nurseries to add links to <u>ARSStore.org</u>.

The referral rate starts at 4%. If a total of 7 or more items are purchased from Amazon in a month, the rate is 6% or more. Typically it will be between 6% and 6.5%. It is 17% on ARS Logo Merchandise.

At <u>ARSStore.org</u>, every purchase you make results in a contribution to the ARS at no additional cost either to you or to the ARS.

In time he met Lanny Pride, a local nurseryman by trade, who had test gardens on his property full of Rhodie's. Their friendship grew; Jim became a student of Lanny's knowledge of plants. After Lanny's death in 1983, Jim and friends had permission to obtain many of Lanny's plants, which by now, were in overgrown gardens once owned by Lanny. It took over three years to move the plants. With all of Jim's knowledge, he continued testing Lanny's plants but, by this time they were growing on Jim's property near Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Through a slide presentation, there is no doubt about the success of his Pride collection. Have you ever seen the Jim & Blanche gardens? What a treat, it makes one feel humble.
